**63/23 Determination of the validity of an application for  
Review of Premises Licence at The Greyhound, 76  
Friar Gate, Derby DE1 1FN**

The Sub-Committee considered a report from the Director of Public Protection and Streetpride asking them to determine whether the application for Review of the Premises Licence at The Greyhound, 76 Friar Gate, Derby DE1 1FN is to be considered as valid in accordance with section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003.

The Sub-Committee considered all the written evidence before them and took account of verbal submissions made by [REDACTED] (Licensing Team, Derby City Council).

The Sub-Committee noted that other than the single occurrence of noise alleged to have occurred on 25 November 2023, the balance of the supporting material forming the majority of evidence related to historic allegations going back to 2010 and which were not within the authority or control of the current licence holder.

It was reported that since the new licence holder had taken over responsibility for the Greyhound public house on 27 October 2023, there had only been one single allegation of noise nuisance reported by [REDACTED], on 25 November 2023. This was currently being investigated by a Senior Environmental Health Officer. It was noted that one breach did not make for a nuisance in the circumstances irrespective of the history of the premises.
