1. The commissioning process for such services
2. Any current or recent contracts or frameworks in place
3. The types of preventative workplace health and wellbeing support being delivered
4. Any identified priorities or gaps in provision

The aim is to better understand how preventative health and wellbeing (including via workplace settings) is being addressed for the Derby population through commissioned services, with a view to developing a programme that aligns with local authority priorities and improves public health outcomes.
